Parents, whose incomes are too high for SSI eligibility, may consider applying if their child has complex health care needs.

Overview: SSI is a needs-based program, so eligibility is based on an adult disability determination along with a consideration of income and assets. Once an individual is 18 years old, the social security administration will consider only that person’s income and assets, even if they are still living at home with their parents. Disability determination for adults is different for adults than for children because it is based on the individual’s medical disability and their ability to work. If an adult is found eligible for SSI, then they are eligible automatically for Medicaid in Wisconsin. The application cannot be submitted before the month of the individual’s 18th birthday, but the application process can be begun earlier on line at: <http://www.ssa.gov>. If additional information is needed, it is possible to stop at any point and save it using a *re-entry number* so that the application process can be continued at a later date.

If an adult is found eligible for SSI, then they are eligible automatically for Medicaid in Wisconsin. The Chippewa County Children and Families Division provides services to protect children who have been abused and/or neglected or at substantial risk of abuse and/or neglect. It is our role to make sure that children have their basic needs met – adequate food, clothing, and shelter; and to make sure they are free from physical, sexual, or emotional injury or exploitation. Our access team is responsible for receiving reports of abuse and neglect and providing referrals and information to community services. **To report child abuse and neglect or request other information, please contact Chippewa County Human Services at 715-726-7788.**

Chippewa County Youth Support and Services: Promotes a juvenile justice system to assist, empower, and build upon the strengths of youth and families facing juvenile delinquency challenges. We strive to protect the community, impose accountability for law violations, and equip juvenile offenders with competencies to live responsibly, productively, and achieve positive outcomes. It is the responsibility of the Chippewa County Youth Support and Services Division to provide services that address issues of juvenile delinquency. The Division places a strong emphasis on services for rehabilitation of delinquent youth. The Division utilizes evidence based programming to protect the community, impose accountability for violations, and equip juvenile offenders with competencies to live responsibly and productively in the community.

Foster Care: Foster care is 24-hour care provided by licensed foster parents for children who cannot live with their parents because they are unsafe, have special care or treatment needs, or other circumstances exist that result in their parents or family are unable to care for them. County human service agencies license and oversee these placements. Generally, placement in foster care is temporary and intended to give the child's family time to make necessary changes so that the child can live safely in his or her home and community. Most children in foster care return home to their families. When children cannot return home, they find permanence through placement with relatives, adoption, or other means.

A loving and supportive foster home and family makes a big difference in the lives of these children. If you are interested in becoming a foster parent, you may obtain more information by contacting Eau Claire County Human Services - Jody Waletzki at 715-839-6788.

Kinship Care: Kinship Care is a program designed to help support a child who resides outside of his or her own home, either temporarily or long term, with a relative. Kinship Care supports the concept of children residing with a relative to alleviate family stress or temporary familial problems, rather than being placed in a foster home or other type of out-of-home placement. Kinship Care may be voluntary or court ordered.

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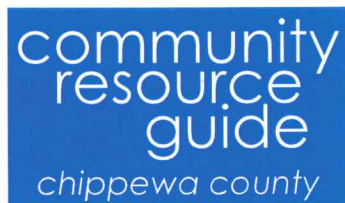

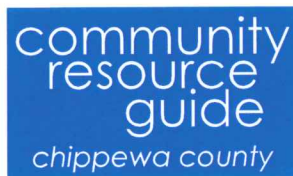
