Chippewa Falls Senior High School 2024-2025 PROFILE

Community:

Chippewa Falls is a rural, residential community located 10 miles north of Eau Claire and 90 miles east of St. Paul, MN. Over 14,100 residents reside within district boundaries and maintain a middle socio-economic level.

Nine schools (six elementary, one middle, one high school and one alternative high school) comprise the public school environment. The district utilizes a K-5, 6-8, 9-12 organizational plan. Ninety percent of the student population is Caucasian and the remaining 10% are Black, Asian, Hispanic, and American Indian. Approximately 50% of our students intend to enroll in a four-year college, 32% in a two-year college or technical college, and approximately four percent enter the military. University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, Lakeland College, and Chippewa Valley Technical College are within 15 miles of Chippewa Falls.

School:

Chippewa Falls Senior High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school with an approximate enrollment of 1500 students. The scholastic program (beginning 2020-2021) is delivered on a four period block schedule over four quarters. Each quarter is nine weeks and credits are awarded at the end of each quarter. Additionally, students have the option of completing their requirements through a virtual program. Chippewa Falls Senior High School has attained "Satisfactory Adequate Yearly Progress" distinction, by exceeding the "No Child Left Behind" requirements in terms of test preparation, graduation rate and reading scores.

Faculty:

High school faculty includes 112 certified staff, 51% have advanced degrees. The current teacher student ratio is 12.5 pupils per staff member with an average class size of 25-30 students.

Class Rank

Class rank is dependent upon performance of courses in grades 9-12. Accelerated and Advanced Placement courses receive equal weight with all other courses. No GPA points are assigned to courses identified as passing (P).

Curriculum:

Our curriculum supports our strategic planning goal: Students will graduate prepared to succeed in post-secondary education and careers, having the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and behaviors necessary to achieve their personal goals and contribute to the common good. A combination of Advanced Placement, career and technical education, fine arts, world language and other post-secondary/dual enrollment classes provide students with the necessary tools to be college and career ready. Additional opportunities are provided through work-based learning.

College Credit Opportunities:

Chippewa Falls Senior High School has a variety of options for students to earn college credit while still in high school. We have 18 Advanced Placement courses, Dual Credit (through partnerships with UW-Oshkosh and UW-Stout), Transcripted Credit (in collaboration with Chippewa Valley Technical College), and Project Lead the Way. Additionally, students can apply for Early College Credit (university-level courses), Start College Now (technical college courses), and High School Academies (technical college courses in a specified pathway).
